Dear Junior Beef Exhibitor:

The Pennsylvania Cattlemen's Association (PCA) will hold its Seventh Jackpot Steer and Heifer Show March 22- 24, 2019 at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex and Expo Center in Harrisburg, PA. In conjunction with the South East Classic, we will bring you two shows under one roof as the Pennsylvania Spring Spectacular Show!

The Junior Heifer Show will begin at 9 a.m. Saturday, March 23, 2019. Classes will be divided by age within breed, depending on the number of entries. Heifers born between September 2017 and December 2018 are eligible. Breed classes will be dependent on number of animals registered in breed. There must be a minimum of five (5) animals in a breed for a class to be specified. In addition to separate classes for breeds meeting number requirements, there will be classes for crossbred breeding heifers, and All Other Breeds (Registered heifers that do not have the breed minimum of five head). The judge will select the top five from each breed class, those will all be eligible for grand champion heifer. Selection of overall grand champion heifer (top 5) will come from the top five of each breed and top five cross breds. All class breaks and breeds are at the sole discretion of the show committee.

Heifers will be checked in from 2 p.m. – 7 p.m. Friday evening only. Doing our best to bring you an efficient, well ran show, we will not be registering or checking in animals the day of the show. Please understand this change is for the best for everyone involved.

The Junior Steer Show is scheduled for Sunday, March 24, to begin at 9:00 a.m. Steer classes will be divided into weight classes, depending on the number of entries. All steers must be born in 2018. All steers will be shown within their breed class based on weight. There must be a minimum of five (5) animals in a breed for a class to be specified. In addition to separate classes for breeds meeting number requirements, there will be classes for crossbred steers, and All Other Breeds (Registered steers that do not have the breed minimum of five head). The judge will select the top five from each breed class, those will all be eligible for rand champion steer. In the cross bred division, the top five light, five middle, and five heavy cross bred champions will be selected and those top fifteen will compete for the top five cross bred steers. Selection of overall grand champion steer (top 5) will come from the top five of each breed and top five cross breds. All class breaks and breeds are at the sole discretion of the show committee.

<u>Steers will be weighed in from 3 pm – 7 pm on Saturday evening only.</u> All steers must be weighed in Friday March 22 (2-7pm) or Saturday March 23 (3-7pm) or they will not be permitted to show.

Doing our best to bring you an efficient, well ran show, we <u>will not be</u> registering or checking in animals the day of the show. Please understand this change is for the best for everyone involved.

Juniors are permitted to register their animal at the show, however please understand <u>we will not register animals day of show.</u> We will register new animals at the late fee rate (\$60) during the specified times above and on the show schedule.

Early entry deadline should be post marked by March 1, 2019. Exhibitors who enter by the early deadline will receive one PCA Show Souvenir.

2019 PCA's Jackpot Steer & Heifer Show HEALTH RULES

A. HEALTH CERTIFICATION FOR CATTLE

- 1. No animal showing evidence of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease shall be allowed entrance into the show.
- 2. All animals must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed by an accredited veterinarian. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be issued on or after February 21, 2019 and bear a 15 digit 840 RFID number as unique permanent identification. Animals will not be admitted into the Farm Show Building without the necessary health papers. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be available at all times as additional inspections of health certificates can be made at the sole discretion of the show committee.

3. VACCINATIONS

It is strongly recommended that all cattle entering the show grounds be currently immunized against IBR, PI3, BRSV, BVD, and rabies. All drug and vaccine label directions should be followed, including but not limited to slaughter withdrawal periods.

4. TUBERCULOSIS REQUIREMENTS

- o No test is required if the animal originates from a tuberculosis free state or zone.
- If the animal originates from a state or zone that is designated "Modified Accredited Advanced" with respect to tuberculosis by USDA it must be tested negative for tuberculosis on or after January 24, 2019.
- o If the animal originates from a state or zone that is designated "Modified Accredited" with respect to tuberculosis by USDA then all animals in the herd that are 12 months of age and older must have been tested negative for tuberculosis within 12 months preceding importation and the individual animals must be tested negative for tuberculosis on or after January 24, 2019.

5. BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS

- 1. If the animal(s) originates from a certified brucellosis free herd or brucellosis class free state, no test is required. Steers do not need a brucellosis test.
- 2. If an animal originates from a herd that is NOT certified brucellosis free in a class A, B, or C state, a negative brucellosis test is required on or after January 24, 2019 for all unvaccinated animals over eight (8) months of age and for all animals that are over fourteen (14) months of age on March 23, 2019.

B. SHOW ETHICS CODE

The Pennsylvania Cattlemen's Jackpot Steer & Heifer Show Committee encourages youth to learn by doing via hands-on learning experiences, and therefore expects participants in the Junior Show to be solely responsible for the care and preparation of their own animals for show and to abide by the Code of Show Ring Ethics. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation of an animal for exhibition is strictly prohibited. Any animal showing evidence of unethical fitting practices, such as tampering with the natural fleshing and muscle development, will be barred from the show and no premiums awarded. The PCA Jackpot Steer and Heifer Show Committee reserves the right to test any animal for the illegal use of drugs or antibiotics.

RULES BREEDING CATTLE & STEERS

1. **OWNERSHIP** - Cattle must be owned by the exhibitor listed on the entry at time of entry and at the time of show.

2. EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY

- a. All exhibitors must be 8 years of age including 21 years of age by January 1st of the current year.
- 3. **REGISTRATION** "All breeding cattle must be registered with their respective breed association. All Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must properly match the registration certificate. Absent, unreadable, or mismatched tattoos will result in disqualification from showing". Steers may be purebred or crossbred. Purebred divisions include Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn and Simmental with numbers permitting. All Other Breeds may include and not be limited to Charolais, Limousin, Limflex, Maine-Anjou, MaineTainer, Shorthorn Plus, SimSolution.

4. ENTRY ELIGIBILITY

- a. Entry must have been owned by and registered in the name of the junior exhibitor. Dual ownership will not be permitted (no exceptions).
- b. Bred and owned animals' date of birth will be considered the owned-by date. Breeder and owner must be identical on the registration certificate.
- c. Heifers born between September 2017 and December 2018 are eligible. Steers must all be born in 2018.
- 5. HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS All cattle must comply with the Health Rules.
- 6. **ENTRY FEES** \$40 per head, entry postmarked by March 1, 2019. Entries postmarked after March 1, 2019 will be \$60 per head.
- 7. **SUBSTITUTIONS** Will not be excepted. No refunds.
- 8. **ARRIVAL TIME** Barns will be open at 12:00 p.m., Friday, March 22, 2019. Heifers must be weighed in/checked in by 7:00 pm Friday March 22, 2019. Steers must be weighed in by 7:00 pm, Saturday, March 23, 2019.
- 9. Tie out stalling will not be offered. If you choose to tie out you must tie out to your trailer and provide your own bedding. You are responsible for cleanup of all personal tie out bedding.
- 10. Stalling is first come first serve therefore stalling assignments will not be made. The show committee asks exhibitors and families to be courteous when reserving stalling for animals. No one is permitted in the barns to reserve stalling before Friday, March 22, 2019 at 12:00 pm.
- 11. **RELEASE TIME** Steers will be released at the conclusion of the steer show, heifers at the conclusion of the heifer show
- 12. Large classes in each breed may be split into more than one class at the discretion of the show committee.
- 13. Heifers will be checked in 2:00 7:00 p.m. Friday, March 22.
- 14. WEIGHING All Steers will be weighed between 3:00-7:00 p.m. Saturday, March 23.

- 15. **SHOW RING ESCAPE** As of 2019 a "three strike" will be implemented. Assistance by another junior exhibitor will be allowed after the first escape, if the animal escapes three times, the exhibitor will be asked to leave the ring for the safety of all other exhibitors.
- 16. Unethical or abusive activities are not allowed and will result in disqualification of the exhibitor from the show at the sole decision of the PCA Show Management. (See PCA Code of Show Ring Ethics.)
- 17. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to see that their animal is present at the specified time and place for weighing and showing.
- 18. The displaying of farm signs, banners, etc. over exhibits is encouraged. These displays must in no way interfere with other exhibitors.
- 19. All tattoos must be legible or animal will be placed into the all other breeds class.
- 20. **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE PROHIBITED ON THE FARM SHOW COMPLEX PREMISES**. If alcoholic beverages are found, then those individuals and their associated parties (exhibitors) will be asked to leave the premises and forfeit any and all premiums.
